Word list: ff words

Does your word end in an *f* sound? Does your word contain a *short vowel sound*? If you answered yes to both questions, its likely that the *f* sound at the end of your word is spelt with the letters *ff*.

For example:

The word *staff* contains a short /a/ sound and ends with an f sound. This means the f needs to be doubled.

The word *cliff* contains a short /i/ sound and ends with an *f* sound. Once again, the *f* needs to be doubled.

The word *cuff* contains a short /u/s sound and ends with an f sound. As before, the f needs to be doubled.

This rule also applies to words that end with *s* and *l* after a *short vowel sound*.
