

## Spelling list: Some harder *ar* words

This list includes longer *ar* words to expand your vocabulary and spelling skills. Words like *argument* , *participate* , and *remarkable* contain the /ar/ sound in different places. Notice where the /ar/ sound falls in each word, and see if you can spot any spelling patterns. To help you learn, try the *Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check* activity and repeat until you feel confident. For extra practice, you can explore this word list's spelling games and resources. With regular practice, you'll find yourself recognizing and using these more challenging *ar* words with ease!
