Spelling list: Unit 14 homophones - set 3

In this list, we explore a final set of homophones featuring the /or/ sound. These words that sound the same but are spelled differently and have distinct meanings.

For instance, sauce (a topping for food) and source (the origin of something) or ball (a round object used in sports or play) and bawl are pairs of words that sound similar but mean different things.

Getting confident with these words will help you avoid spelling mistakes and improve your writing. Use a *Learn the Words* activity with these homophones to strengthen your understanding and usage!
