

## Spelling list: Unit 14 homophones - set 3

In this list, we explore a final set of homophones featuring the /or/ sound. These words that sound the same but are spelled differently and have distinct meanings.

For instance, *sauce* (a topping for food) and *source* (the origin of something) or *ball* (a round object used in sports or play) and *bawl* are pairs of words that sound similar but mean different things.

Getting confident with these words will help you avoid spelling mistakes and improve your writing. Use a *Learn the Words* activity with these homophones to strengthen your understanding and usage!

sauce	I like lots of <b>sauce</b> on my burger.
source	The <b>source</b> of this river is in those hills.
maul	Lions <b>maul</b> their prey.
mall	Our local <b>mall</b> will be busy today.
haul	<b>Haul</b> on the rope to moor the boat.
hall	The meeting will be in the <b>hall</b> .
taut	The tent ropes must be <b>taut</b> .
taught	I was <b>taught</b> to play the piano.
court	The tennis <b>court</b> was too wet for play.
caught	The thief was <b>caught</b> in the act.
ball	Roll the <b>ball</b> to me.
bawl	The upset baby did nothing but <b>bawl</b> all night.
floor	I scrubbed the <b>floor</b> until it was spotless.
flaw	There is a <b>flaw</b> in your argument.
course	This <b>course</b> should help your spelling.
coarse	Some sugar has <b>coarse</b> grains.
