## Spelling list: Words with doubled letters

These words follow the doubling rule, where the final consonant doubles when adding a vowel suffix to a word ending in a single short vowel and one consonant.

For example:

flap + -ing fla pp ing

dip + -ed di pp ed

This pattern helps keep the vowel sounds short and clear. The list below includes examples to help you recognise and apply this rule.

flapping The bird was **flapping** its wings.

getting My spelling is **getting** much better.

runner The **runner** showed great endurance.

spotted We **spotted** a kingfisher on the river bank.

biggish The promotion will be a **biggish** step up for her.

jogger The **jogger** runs five miles a day.

funny Bob's wedding speech was very **funny** .

snobbish I don't like **snobbish** people.

snappy He was very **snappy** when he was hungry.

setting The house is in a tranquil riverside **setting**.

hidden I have **hidden** my sweets from my brother.

trodden I think you have **trodden** in something smelly.

dipped I **dipped** my foot in the freezing water.
