Spelling list: Change y to i

In this section, we will look at an important spelling rule for words that end in a consonant followed by y. When you add a suffix to these words, you should change the y to i, unless the suffix starts with an i.

Knowing when to change *y* to *i* will improve your spelling. For instance, the word *happy* changes to *happiest* when you add *-est*. You will also change *study* to *studies* and *beauty* to *beautiful* using this rule.

By learning this rule, you will feel more confident in your spelling. As you go through the examples, you will see how these changes work with different words, helping you understand this key part of English spelling.

dry I dry my hair with a towel.

dried A **dried** plum is called a prune.

happy The child was very **happy**.

happiest It was the **happiest** day of my life.

reply I need a **reply** by the weekend.

replied Have you **replied** to that email?

fly I love to **fly** my kite.

flies He **flies** in the aeroplane to Spain.

nasty A bully is a **nasty** person.

nastiness The **nastiness** of some players spoiled the game.

pony Did you have a ride on the black **pony**?

ponies Rosie loves to ride **ponies**.

study You will need to **study** hard to become a doctor.

studies A zoologist **studies** animals.

beauty She loved watching **beauty** tutorials online.

beautiful There's a **beautiful** view from my balcony.
